### Resettlement, County, and State Updates

- Reception and Placement: VOLAGs:

Alliance for African Assistance: No updates.

Catholic Charities: February: No arrivals in June and none anticipated for

July. Some in May: Afghan SIV and a single Iraqi SIV; Good amount of Cuban

Nation, many single walk-ins. 53 since march  $1^{\rm st}$  and 5 so far in June.

**International Rescue Committee:** 18 refugees for June, not including any

SIVs. There are 7 bookings for July. Primary pipeline is from Myanmar,

Thailand, Malaysia, Afghan, Syria, and Iraq.

**Jewish Family Services:** In the month of June we expect to see 25 people and 4 cases. 2 from Afghanistan & 2 from the Congo. In July we are expecting 2 cases with a total of 4 people, one from Afghanistan.

### County of San Diego:

- Abdi Abdillahi, County Refugee Coordinator
- May 65 (30 refugees, 17 Cuban nation, 3 asylees, 2 trafficking victims, 13 SIVs
- 2018-2019-550 total
  - Primary refugees 239, secondary refugees 4, asylees 34, Cuban Nation 143, trafficking 3, SIVs 127
  - 43% of the year is primary refugee, 26% Cuban nation
  - May 46% are refugees
  - Top 3 arrivals: Afghanistan 29% Haiti 26% Congolese 17%, the rest 28%
- Update on arrivals from the state report: refugee as of May 2019 nationwide = Refugees 18,051, SIVs 4,688 for a total of 22,739 out of the 30,000 refugee ceiling.
  - Statewide refugees 1,031, SIVs 1,661 = 2,697



- Based on this rate by the end of September we will be at 27,000 out of the 30,000 cap set by President Trump
- **State Advisory Committee:** 11:16 on recorder
  - o Kathi Anderson
  - o We just had a recent meeting in Oakland last week
  - Last several meetings have focused on asylum seekers for 1st time in history of SAC and the Refugee Programs Bureau that they are the focus. We are very excited.
  - We have had panelists come and talk to the community from the legal, mental health, education perspective, etc. perspective
  - Other significant part of the meeting that you may want to pay attention to was dedicated to the GRACE Act, so instead of a cap we would prioritize a minimum threshhold number that has to be resettled in the United States
- County Refugee Health
  - o May we had a 105 refugees
  - June we saw 51, largely from Haiti, the Congo, and Iraq
  - We do case management to help patients who are unfamiliar with our health system, including appointment reminders, home visits, etc. Thus far it has been a very successful program
  - It would be a good model for any type of health program, especially in terms of look intensive case management
