 - d) Forum participants introduced themselves.
- 2. Membership and Financials.
 - a) Oren Robinson (Treasurer) gave the following report:
 - Current membership is 43.
 - Benefits of membership include being able to nominate individuals for the forums' annual Refugee Resilience Award, vote during elections, have a resource table at the forum's World Refugee Day Event at no cost, and have name posted on forum website.
 - Membership fees can be paid online at <u>www.sdrefugeeforum.og</u> or by check.
- 3. San Diego Refugee Forum Task Force Updates.
 - a) Advocacy Task Force: Rebecca Miranda reported that the Advocacy Task force met last week and decided to focus on events to increase awareness of refugee issues.. Will develop action toolkit and will be looking for educational materials related to advocacy to distribute at events. Rebecca Miranda was elected co-chair of the task force. The next meeting of the Advocacy task force will be **August 8, 2017 at 12 p.m**. at the Alliance for African Assistance.

- e) Health Task Force. Madelyne Wagner reported that the Health Task Force met on Tuesday, July 11, 2017 at 1:00 p.m. Agenda included a presentation by the Legal Aid Society of San Diego: Consumer Center for Health Education and Advocacy. The next meeting of the Health Task Force will be Tuesday, August 8, 2017 at 1 p.m. at Niles Sisters Development Initiative.

- 4. Reception and Placement (Resettlement Agencies Arrival Data and Updates)
 - Alliance for African Assistance: No report.
 - Catholic Charities: No report.
 - International Rescue Committee: Thirteen (13) arrivals in June 2017 from Afghanistan and Somalia. David Murphy shared update on the current status of court rulings on refugee arrivals which is changing on a weekly basis. Current maximum number of arrivals in U.S. for 2017 federal fiscal year is 50,000, and this number has been met. Because the original cap was 110,000, there are many refugees in the pipeline. No additional refugees admitted unless they have been accepted by a resettlement agency and have a "bona fide" U.S. tie.
 - Jewish Family Services: Fifty-two (52) arrivals in June (mostly SIVs from Afghanistan and Iraq). Twenty-six (26) arrivals expected in July.
- 5. County of San Diego. Maggie Fenn reported arrival data for San Diego County.
 - Total number of arrivals for the month of June 2017 was 136, similar to the previous month's total number of 138.
 - Monthly refugee arrivals report now includes data at the bottom of page listing the number of CalWORKS cases, number of *individuals within the* CalWORKS cases including children, and number of singles or couples with no children.
 - Monthly refugee arrival data is posted on the forum website under "Resources" tab.
